hermeneutic.

ple as well. Papers presented at this conference usually cover eschatological issues and for the most part avoid what would be divisive soteriological issues.

I heard many excellent papers on subjects like Progressive Dispensationalism (PD), Hermeneutics (principles of interpretation), and the Kingdom.

Here are a few of the nuggets I came away with:

- PD rarely speaks of the rapture, believes in one people of God in the eternal state, sees an overlap between the church age and the Millennium (with Jesus ruling on the throne of David in both eras), does not believe the kingdom was reoffered to Israel by the apostles, and adopts a hermeneutic that is no longer a literal
- A number of Classic Dispensationalists (CDs) are now arguing that there is no sense whatsoever that the kingdom is already here. Men like Stan Toussaint argue that the kingdom is entirely future. It did draw near during the ministry of Jesus. But the kingdom was rejected and will not arrive until after the Tribulation. Such people reject the already-but-not-yet idea entirely.
- Many of the students at schools which formerly taught CD but now primarily teach PD tend to be unaware of what CD is.

I enjoyed this conference and the opportunity to hear a number of excellent papers and visit with Free Grace friends. Thank you for making it possible for me to represent the Grace Movement in ways like this.
