I was privileged to give the Easter message at VSBC. I love preaching on the resurrection of Jesus and telling people about the free gift of eternal life.

For my passage I chose John 11 and the raising of Lazarus. "It's a Wonderful Life" was the title of my message. I concentrated especially on 11:25-27 and Jesus' discussion about resurrection and eternal life with Martha, the sister of Lazarus. However, I actually read every verse in the chapter, and commented on most of them.

I have always found it remarkable that though Jesus could have healed his friend from afar, instead, He chose to let him die and remain in the tomb for 4 days before He arrived. In my estimation John 11 is the key chapter in John's Gospel and John 11:25-27 are the crucial verses in the crucial chapter.

There were lots of visitors and it was a joy to make the good news clear to all present.

Pastor Arch Rutherford is in a wonderful series on the seven letters to the seven churches in Revelation 2-3. On this Sunday he spoke about the letter to the church at Pergamos, Rev 2:12-17. I really enjoyed hearing Arch preach.

We did discuss the Reformed and Arminian views, but since that was not the main point of the presentation, the overall tone was very positive and upbeat. Unfortunately, we didn't record it. However, I plan to do it again soon so that we can have it on audio.
