When September 11, 2001 occurred, we experienced a substantial drop in financial support as did many non-profits. Thankfully, over the past two and a half years, new supporters have joined us and have made up the shortfall. Today our support is back to where it was then, and this time, with a broader donor base, which is a good improvement.

We are extremely grateful for you and your support. We pray that God will bless you richly now and in the life to come for your generous support of clear gospel proclamation.

Help Us End the Year Well

Our fiscal year ends June 30th. This year we reduced our budget and it appears our revenue will exceed our projections. This is extremely important due to the fact that our reserves have been seriously depleted in the last several years due in part to the fallout of 9/11.

If revenue exceeds budget, this will allow us to expand our ministry. Most likely it would allow us to hire a parttime intern (8 or 16 hours a week) to help us with our conference, commentary, coordinating Bob's speaking, etc.
