

Community Ministry Whitewater, KS September 10-11

T've known Steve and Vicki Anderson and their son Joe for **▲**about 5 years now. You may remember that this past summer I spoke in Southern California to a high school Bible Study Group called The Fight Club. Well, I got a chance to see them in their home area.

On Saturday afternoon I hung out with some of the Fight Club guys. We had burgers and played Shuffleboard not with sticks, but on a very long table with something like salt on it. The pucks really went. It was hard to keep from sliding them off the other end, maybe 25 feet away. We also went to a huge sporting goods store and just looked at guns and fishing poles and all kinds of interesting stuff.

That night I gave my testimony to the Fight Club, their parents, and visitors from town. There were about 60 or so present. I also talk to them about 3 ways in which people take the warning passages in the Bible: 1) we are being warned about losing eternal life, 2) we are being warned that though we are eternally secure, we are accountable, or 3) we are being warned about proving we never had eternal life. There were three tables there and I joking labeled each table as having one of those views. The school superintendent, who was sitting at the accountability table, table 2,


I was fully challenged. Still, it went well and people grasped what the passages were warning against.
