I think that GES is one of the most worthwhile organizations and I have enjoyed learning and studying under people who obviously have the gospel straight.



Paul's words come to mind in this regard: "Not that I seek the gift, but I seek the fruit that abounds to your account" (Phil 4:17). Amen.


Commentary Support Update 151 Gifts to Go
