

Evangelical Theological Society (ETS) Annual Meeting


Atlanta, GA November 16-19

ETS is a group of conservative Bible scholars from around the US and Canada. We unite around the truth of the inerrancy of Scripture. There were over 2,600 present this year, made up mainly of seminary and Bible college professors.



I've been attending and presenting papers since 1989. Never before had I presented two. This year I was selected to present two messages. My first presentation was on the error of so-called final justification by works. There is no justification by works before God, ever. Amazingly, with a conference theme of justification by faith, most of the presentations argued for initial justification by faith alone and final justification by works! Most of the presenters weren't even qualifying their statements with something like, "Of course, final justification by works is a formality since all who are justified by faith alone are guaranteed to be justified by works." No. The speakers, including Calvinists, suggested that initial justification by faith did not guarantee final justification by works. Needless to say, this was very discouraging.

My second paper was on the Biblical concept of perishing. I showed it primarily deals with death and loss, and only rarely refers to eternal condemnation. (This will be one of the chapters in my new book on the ten most misunderstood words in the Bible.)




