James' point is that men are justified in two ways: by faith and by works. One can only be justified before God by faith. However, as Abraham illustrates, the one who is justified by faith before God can also be justified before men by works.

roy Jensen was welcomed to the board as a new mem-**L** ber. He is a corporate executive in Phoenix.

At this board meeting we had to face declining revenue. We took in \$308,000 in fiscal 2003 (July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003), which was \$50,000 under budget, \$20,000 less than the previous year's revenue, and \$19,000 below our actual expenses.

We cut the budget severely to get to a \$311,000 budget for July 2003 to June 2004. For example, Grant Hawley, our intern for the past year will be leaving us in mid August. He will be greatly missed. Additionally, our new secretary will be part-time (24 hours a week) rather than full-time as we had hoped. If by December contributions have picked up enough, we may then be able to increase this position to 32 or even 40 hours a week.

We took other measures as well, the biggest of which is that when our lease is up at the end of October, we will be moving to a much cheaper office, reducing our monthly

office expense significantly. Of course, how we do that is not at all clear since office space is expensive.

We feel fortunate that we didn't have to make more drastic cuts. While searching for a new staff person, Cathy interviewed several people who had been laid off from Insight for Living (Chuck Swindoll's radio ministry) based in Frisco, TX. One had survived the first two cuts and only lost her job on the third wave of cuts. She told Cathy that in addition to people, Insight eliminated 15 languages from their international radio program offerings.

Many ministries are hurting, and most are suffering more than we are. So we are especially thankful to be able to continue to minister.

We still plan to move forward with a new book on assurance by me. We dare not suspend new ministries like that. In addition, we are moving aggressively toward completing the one-volume commentary by the end of next year so it can be in print by the end of 2005.

Ridge Pointe Fellowship Dallas, TX July 13


