Will they

submit to his leadership? In Genesis 42 they do confess their sin, though they do not know that he is Joseph or that he understands

them, for he had spoken to them with a translator.

Repentance was necessary before the brothers would be allowed to travel to Egypt, where the nation would grow and develop. So harmony with our spiritual brothers and sisters is necessary for our growth and development as Christians. If we are out of fellowship
