

Mark Gray Hit by Truck While Riding Bike

Mark handles all data entry and order fulfillment. He is the one you normally talk to on the phone. He is a great guy. On Wednesday May 17 he was starting out on a 70 mile bike ride. Just two miles into the ride, a truck ran a stop sign and hit Mark, breaking his fibula



in two places, bruising nearly his entire body, and causing soft tissue damage to his left shoulder. Because of the combination of injuries, Mark has needed 24 hour in house nursing care since the accident. On May 29 Mark had surgery on his right ankle to repair one of the two fractures with a plate and screws.

We hope to have Mark back in the office by July. Please pray for his recovery.



We Need Your Help on Gift Journal Subscriptions

Our journal subscriptions have fallen to a low level. While \$18 per year for only two issues of a journal may seem like a lot, that is actually a very reasonable price and especially so in light of our low level of subscriptions.

We need to boost our subscriptions. Right now we are offering gift subscriptions for just \$9.25 per year for U.S. addresses. For just \$37 you could give a one-year journal subscription to your pastor, Sunday school teacher, Bible study teacher, and a seminary or Bible college in your state. For just \$74 you could give four people or institutions two-year subscriptions to our journal. You can give up to four-year subscriptions to U.S. addresses for just \$9.25 per year per subscription. (Foreign subscriptions are excluded due to the high cost of mailing journals outside the U.S.)

Since some people already have subscriptions, if we find out that one of those you sign up already has a subscription, we will notify you and give you a chance of giving that subscription to someone else.

We do ask that you send an email or letter to the people or institutions you give a free journal subscription and let them know that the first issue, Spring 2012, should be received in July.
