Spain. My daughter Kathryn and I have started a weekly Free Grace Skype class on John's Gospel (with an emphasis on the saving message) with about ten people in Spain. Some in that country reached out to us through the GES website. They wanted to look through the Gospel of John for the content of the Gospel. Two of



First Quarter 2020 Giving Up in Spite of Virus

Shelter in place orders began March 19th and by the end of March most states were shut down. But the stock market crash began ten days earlier. I thought our support would have dropped significantly in March due to lost jobs, lost savings, and health concerns. Instead, our revenue was up in March and January through March.

January-March 2019 gifts and sales: \$97,383 January-March 2020 gifts and sales: \$114,723. Donations were up \$3,000 in March and \$7,000 Jan-Mar.

Sales were up \$2,000 in March and \$10,000 Jan-Mar. Thank you so much for your generous support. We realize that revenue may drop in April-June as financial woes mount. But we have reserves for times like this, and our God has the deepest of pockets. We decided not to file for small business relief from the government. Our board decided that since we rely on God and His people, it would be inappropriate to seek relief from the government.
