n May 5th, GES was able to make our first international trip since Covid-19. For two weeks, Kathryn taught at Ambassador International University (AIU), which is about two hours outside of Lusaka, Zambia.

This was the fourth time that Ken and/or Kathryn taught at AIU, and Lord-willing both will return next year to teach two more courses. Kathryn taught "Progress of Redemption" to a group of 25 guys, and the response was positive across the board. She was able to give each of her students a copy of Zane Hodges' trilogy, *The Free Grace Primer*. Assurance of salvation was a hot topic during the class discussions and the informal evening rap sessions. Students asked about several tough texts, which included James 2, Romans 10:9-10, and Hebrews 10. It was a fruitful time, and we are looking forward to further ministry with AIU in the future.
